The instructor is the dynamic Dr. Mark Johnson of Global Wildlife Resources of Bozeman, MT. The course is a product of Dr. Johnson’s experience handling feral (fearful) dogs throughout the world including the Caribbean, India, tribal lands, and rescue operations after Hurricane Katrina. He is also author of the Feral Dog Blog.

The first course is chemical and non-chemical capture for animal control officers and is the most extensive course for ACOs taught in North America. The second course is a non-chemical capture course for anyone wanting to handle fearful dogs in a good way. This class is essential for shelter staff, disaster responders, rescue workers responding to hoarding cases/puppy mills, spay/neuter programs, and those rescuing dogs in general.
